## **Building Projects & Grants**

If you are planning a building project over the next year or two, I would like to draw you attention to two sessions that we have planned.

On Monday 31<sup>st</sup> March we have a session that will go through the things you need to have in place before you start on a building project such as setting up a project team, developing a vision, appointing an architect and developing initial proposals.

On Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> April we will be joined to colleagues from the Heritage Lottery Fund who will explain about the grants that they can provide. The session will also provide general information about applying for other grants and the information that you will need to have in place.

## **Evaluation of Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme**

The Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) has commissioned research on the repair and maintenance of historic places of worship. Places of worship that have been 'listed' for their special architectural or historic interest can generally reclaim the VAT paid through The <u>Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme</u>. This scheme has operated since 2001 and is funded by the UK government through DCMS. Can you please encourage listed places of worship to respond to this survey to evaluate the scheme.

The short online survey is to help build understanding of individual places of worship's experience of the scheme. This survey consists of around 25 questions and will play a vital role in understanding the outcomes and impacts of the scheme. As many places of worship as possible are asked to participate, to produce reliable findings.

Could you please complete the survey if your Church is Listed. The survey is here and is open until 25 March.

## **Energy Footprint Tool for 2024**

Thank you for those of you who have completed the EFT over the last couple of months and so far, almost 30% of churches have entered their data. We would really appreciate an early response to this so that we have the data in the first part of the year. With this in mind I would be grateful if you could remind treasurers, as they finalise the end of year church accounts, to put the energy bills to one side to complete the EFT.

#### **Disability Project**

We have now received applications for all of the large grant funding that was allocated for our diocese and no further applications are now being accepted. If this situation changes and additional funding is available, I will let you know. Applications for the small grants of up to £5,000 remain open and are on a first come first served basis, so if you have a project that might qualify, I would suggest that you get applications in as soon as possible

## **Online Faculty System Update**

The Online Faculty System is currently being redesigned and the new system will hopefully remove some of the issues that people have found with the current system. The faculty process itself will not change but how it appears on the online system will look different. The transfer to the new system looks likely to occur early in the Autumn but final details are still to confirmed. I will be doing some training over the summer and will confirm dates as soon as possible.

The current system for Durham Diocese currently has over 130 active faculties, however 80 of those have been issued and are waiting for parishes to confirm that the work has been completed. I would be grateful if you could check your parishes faculty records and update these by the end of February. We also have a large number that were started some years ago but have not proceeded beyond the initial stage. I will remove those started before 2024 from the system unless parishes confirm that they are still planning to proceed with the work.

#### **Heating**

If your church boiler is over 20 years old, now is the time to start considering options for the future. A boiler can fail at any point but if you have a boiler over 20 years old the chance is much greater and it is also more likely that parts may not be available for them. Since 2022, in line for the Church of England's Net Zero Carbon pledge, any new boilers have required a faculty application and as part of that application you have to be able to justify the replacement of a gas boiler rather than moving to a lower carbon heating solution.

If you have an oil boiler these cannot be replaced after 2025, so looking at alternatives now will save time when you need to find an alternative.

## Living alongside bats in churches grant

The next round of the Living Alongside Bats in Churches grant is now open and will close at **9am on the 28 April**. These grants are especially intended to help churches who are facing another summer of lots of cleaning get the help they need. Grants can be awarded for:

- Pew covers
- New hoovers
- A telescopic brush
- Specialist cleaning
- Bat detectors for future events (in addition to cleaning equipment)

A requirement of the grant is that the church holds a positive community event inspired by nature. Examples of these include:

- Local schools having a bat day
- Several bat walks/evenings with local bat groups
- Bat inspired flower show
- Community event making pew covers
